We will spend as much of the day as possible outside, where they are provided with an optimal environment for childhood development.

The outdoors offers an abundance of sensory experiences, more diverse gross and fine motor challenges, varied open ended materials, and endless opportunities for imaginative play, all of which are crucial to all areas of development. We bring material for discovery from nature back to the Centre. In addition, children will develop a sense of wonder and a deeper respect for our environment. Children are inherently curious and eager to learn.

CURRICULUM

At Cedar Brook we will use the New Brunswick K-3 curriculum as a guide to direct the learning opportunities for our students in the areas of Language Arts and Mathematics. This is to ensure the students will be able to transition to a public-school system at the end of grade 3. Language Arts and Mathematics will be presented in center-based classrooms as well as the forest.

We will also be following curriculum documents and guidelines developed by Forest and Natures Schools of Canada, an institute of Child and Nature Alliance of Canada.

CLASS SIZE



Cedar Brook will value and recognize the importance of relationships and connections between the children and teacher, therefore we maintain a class size of 12 students. This allows for the teacher to personalize the learning opportunities for each child's strengths. Depending on the learning happening in the classroom, there may be an additional staff member who will join the class for added support. While in the forest we will always have two staff members with the children.

INCLUSION POLICY

At Cedar Brook we will make every attempt possible to include all children. We believe that all children have the right, with appropriate assistance, to attend a centre of their choice and receive quality care, education and social interaction with their peers. Our staff are dedicated to work with families and outside assistance (AIS, FACE, etc.) to ensure all children receive the best education we can provide.

We will accept all children into our program if space allows it at the time of enrollment if proper supports are in place. All children will have the same range of program options for enrolment regardless of their needs. We will then observe and develop a plan to help with their development.

Our main goal is to provide quality programming and education for all children enrolled in our facility. There are times unfortunately where the additional support needed is unavailable and we are unable to support the learning of a child and in proportions making sure each classroom in the facility can develop, play and learn as a team.

Prior to considering dismissal when faced with additional challenges we will follow steps:

1. Observe and document challenges with child and identify potential goals
2. Meet with the parents and educator to discuss and collaborate goals, set a defined list and create a plan
3. Reaching out to external community supports
4. Revisiting the plan, and if needs still cannot be met we will continue to evaluate all options.

TEACHER AND QUALIFICATIONS

Cedar Brook is committed to ensuring children have access to the best educators, we employ certified teachers who have completed a recognized education degree. We also employ other educators who have backgrounds in Forestry and other outdoor related skills to enhance the Forest School program. We know a teacher has a tremendous impact on the learning of children, therefore, we hire teachers who have qualifications such as:

- ✓ Bachelor of Education degree
- ✓ Experience with programming in an outdoor setting
- ✓ Experience or familiarity in a variety of outdoor skills
- ✓ Knowledge of Outdoor/Forest school philosophy and its importance for child development
- ✓ Experience with child centered, inquiry-based learning
- ✓ Understanding physical and mental wellness and how it relates to development
- ✓ Experience with center-based literacy and numeracy instruction
- ✓ Experience and knowledge of assessment practices in literacy and numeracy



TIME OUTSIDE

Children at Cedar Brook will have regular and repeated access to natural spaces, such as forests, creeks, and gardens. The amount of time will vary depending on the season as well as the weather. Our educators perform risk assessments daily, and one of the aspects we take into consideration is the weather.



At Cedar Brook, our students come dressed for all types of weather, sun, rain, and snow! Part of the authentic learning in the forest takes place in all types of weather.

Potential Benefits of Participating in Forest and Nature Schools:

- Improved confidence, social skills, communication, motivation, and concentration (O'Brien & Murray, 2007);
- Improved physical stamina, fine and gross motor skills (O'Brien & Murray, 2007);
- Improved creativity and resilience;
- Improved academic achievement and self-regulation;
- Reduced stress and increased patience, self-discipline, capacity for attention, and recovery from mental fatigue; (Russell et al., 2013, p. 482);
- Improved higher level cognitive skills (Atchlet, Strayer & Atchley, 2012);

LEARNING OUTSIDE

Children will be engaged in child centered, inquiry-based learning while outside. Our educators take on many roles in the forest, facilitator, researcher, friend, guide to allow children to seek out the wonders and



awe that exist in the forest daily.

There will be times when we will follow the children's lead and assist in the discovery of a nearby creek, a birds nest, plants and there will be other times that we will facilitate learning in specific areas of the forest that are connected to larger learning themes.

Children will develop a multitude of skills such as fine and gross motor,

self-regulation, independence, social skills and cooperation. These skills form the foundation on which strong academics are developed.

I will understand problem solving, self-exploration, decision making, number relationships, structures, complex vocabulary, cause and effect, creativity and my natural world when I am big, because I play outside while I am little.

A TYPICAL DAY

7:00 - 8:30	Arrival of children for before school care
8:30	School day begins in the classroom
8:30-9:30	Morning Routines, learning centers and teacher focus on literacy. Individual or small groups will work with the teacher in literacy activities.
9:30-10:00	Snack, play and community discussions
10:00-11:00	Mid morning routines, learning centers and teacher focus on mathematics. Individual or small groups will work with the teacher in mathematics activities..
11:00-11:15	Forest Play Prep
11:15-12:00	Forest Play
12:00-12:30	Lunch (inside or out, weather dependent)
12:30-1:00	Free Play in the Forest
1:00-2:30	Afternoon in the Forest – inquiry-based learning. We set out to our destination to explore, play, do art, make music, dance and sing, read stories, run and jump, collect stuff, learn practical skills, look for wildlife, scoop and pour, build, play games etc.
2:30-3:00	Free Play in the Forest
3:00-3:30	Back at the center for an afternoon snack, getting ready for home and discovery centers.
3:00-5:00	Departure of children during after school care

CLOTHING IN THE FOREST

WINTER:

- Two winter hats [must cover ears and stay on the head]
- Balaclava or neck warmer [no scarves please due to risk of strangulation]
- Two pairs of warm, waterproof mitts
- One warm, waterproof snowsuit
- One set of warm, waterproof boots
- Wool socks
- Three base layers: thermal shirt and pants, middle layer, wool/fleece sweater (cotton is not recommended for cold weather conditions)

SPRING:

- Rain gear [waterproof boots, pants, jacket], with extra insulation on colder days
- Wool socks on colder days [they insulate even when wet]
- Sneakers for running shoes [please no open toe shoes even in summer]
- Sun Hat [for warmer months]
- Warmer sweater or jacket for colder days
- Bug Jacket (optional)

SUMMER:


- Rain gear [waterproof boots, pants, jacket]

FALL:


- Rain gear [waterproof boots, pants, jacket]

FOCUS ON LITERACY AND NUMERACY

At Cedar Brook we use the New Brunswick Curriculum as a guide for Language Arts and Mathematics instruction. We recognize the importance of providing research-based literacy and numeracy instruction to ensure our students will be successful. There will be a constant emphasis on both literacy and numeracy while in the classroom as well as in the forest. There is a great importance to support learners in the five major elements of reading as well as provide numeracy instruction that follows a



concrete-pictorial-abstract model. Our teacher will provide guided instruction in literacy and numeracy daily to ensure that each child develops their skill set to their highest potential.



FOCUS IN THE CLASSROOM



While in the classroom, children are engaged in a learning center approach. Learning centers will change over time depending on student interest or the types of discoveries being made outside in the forest. The learning centers will offer students the opportunity to create, build, or imagine while the teacher oversees skill development. There will permanent learning centers in the areas of literacy and numeracy, as children will be immersed with materials to develop concepts of print, reading skills, printing and numbers.

PUBLIC SYSTEM AT THE END OF GRADE 3

At Cedar Brook we recognize that families have a choice in their child's education and are honoured with the families who choose us. We believe that each child who attends Cedar Brook Learning Center will be prepared for the public system. Our students will have the necessary literacy and numeracy foundational skills in order to excel in the public system.

Further, our students will have superior skills in

Tuition includes before and after school care.

Tuition is inclusive of all other expenses, fees and supplies.

By enrolling at Cedar Brook, it is recognized the family is agreeing to a 10 month school year with 10 months of payments, if a family decides to leave the center for whatever reason, the family will be responsible for providing 1 month notice and applicable payment.

Payments:

- Payments can be made bi-weekly or monthly. Bi-Weekly payments are to be made on Mondays no later than 12 noon.
- Payments are to be arranged in the form of automatic payments through your bank or E-Transfer. E-transfer Option- Send to CedarBrookNB@gmail.com Password- Forest
- Late payment - There will be a twenty-dollar late fee for everyday that payment is overdue.
- When enrolling, you are reserving a space that cannot be used by anyone else. Since our cost remains constant throughout the year, payment for the space reserved must be made without exception. Your Bi-weekly rate will remain the same throughout the year, even if your

child is not present due to sickness, holidays, snow days, power outages etc.

MISCELLANEOUS

1. Hours of Operation

The center is open from 7:30 AM-5:00 PM. Monday to Friday.

We are closed for all Statutory Holidays listed below, Christmas Eve day at Noon, New Years Eve at Noon, and Easter Monday.

2. School Start and End Times

The school day begins at 8:30am, to ensure your child and the other children receive exceptional quality, we ask families to have your child ready and on time for school on a regular basis. If your child is going to be late or needs to leave early, please contact Cedar Brook as soon as possible.

3. Late Pick-Up Charges

If for some emergency reason you are unable for pick-up on time, please call the center to let us know so that arrangements can be made until you are able to do so. If you are late picking up your child without reason, or on a regular basis, there will be a charge of \$5.00 for every 15 minutes you are late. For example, a late pick-up at 5:35 would be an extra \$10.00 charge.

4. Fire Drills and Procedures

Fire drills are carried out and recorded on a monthly basis. If the circumstance ever arises that we need to evacuate the daycare, the

children will be transported by Trius bus to (323 Carriage Hill Rd). At that time, parents will be notified immediately.

5. Confidentiality Policy

Information regarding any child and /or his/her family shall not be released, either orally or in writing, to anyone other than the legal guardians of the child or those authorized by law to receive such information. In the case of emergency or injury to the child, information may be released to the police authorities or medical staff attending to the child. Access to a child's record is given only to the legal guardians of the child and to the regular staff of the program and to the Dept. of Education and Early Childhood Development.

Confidentiality of families is always to be respected.

6. Video Surveillance

There is a video surveillance system set up in all classrooms at the centre as well outside of the building. This gives the Administrator the ability to observe all activities throughout the day.

7. Illness & Emergency Care Policies

As mandated by the Dept. of Education and Early Learning all children who attend the center must be well enough to participate in all aspects of the program. For the safety of other children, your child may NOT attend if they are showing symptoms of the following:

- Elevated temperature (over 38.5 degrees Celsius)
- Vomiting

- Skin rash
- Communicable diseases

If any child shows any of these symptoms, we will notify the parents that their child will be required to be picked up within that hour.

We require all parents to sign a permission form for emergency medical care. In case of an emergency you will be contacted to meet staff at the nearest hospital. Please notify the Center if your child contracts a communicable disease in order that we may notify other parents and the Department of Health. Re-admittance will be in accordance with health

Regulations. All parents will be notified within 12 hours if a communicable disease is detected. The guidelines of Management of Illness must be followed based on Dept. of Education and Early Childhood Dev. Health Standards.

We also will need a phone call if your child will be absent due to illness.

We also require a current copy of children's inoculations.

8. Medication

It is the law of our Government that all medication must be labelled with the child's name and dosage for the children be in the original prescription bottle or package for us to administer it to the child. It is policy that you give written instructions and must sign form daily.

9. Departure

Your child will not be released to anyone other than the parents or those authorized by the parents. It is the parent's responsibility to

notify the centre in advance of any special arrangements for release. We reserve the right to verify the information. If there is an emergency that prevents you from picking up your child on time, please let us know as soon as possible so that alternate arrangements may be made.

10. Snacks and Lunches

Parents are required to provide healthy lunches and two healthy snacks per day. Please include an ice pack in your child's lunch.

11. Behavior Management

To encourage positive behaviors our philosophy is to begin with well defined limitations and basic rules for the children. We rely on positive reinforcement, redirection and good role modeling to achieve this.

Should an "incident" between two children occur, they are encouraged to discuss their problem with the caregivers and / or children that are involved in the "incident".

The staff will NOT use any form of physical punishment, verbal or emotional abuse or denial of physical necessities.

12. Child Abuse Policy

The Administrator and/or Director and staff are responsible to advise the local office of the Dept. of Education and Early Learning of any suspected case of abuse or neglect. Any staff member suspecting child abuse shall report the incident at once. A written record containing date of referral and related date(s) of incidents and circumstances contributing to the case will be maintained.

15. Entering and Leaving Cedar Brook Early Learning Centre

We understand that starting a new centre is a big adjustment not only for the child but for everyone involved. It has been our experience that children tend to bond much quicker in the absence of the parents. This may take time, or it may happen immediately depending on the child.

16. Transportation

Transportation to and from school is the responsibility of the parents/guardians

17. Discharge Policy

The centre has the right to discontinue services at any time. Prior to taking this drastic approach, a meeting will be held with the parent/caregiver.

18. COVID-19

Cedar Brook Early Learning Center follows all mandated regulations and protocols from the Department of Early Childhood and Education and Public Health. We will be following a high standard of cleaning of our facility and ensure surfaces are regularly sanitized.

One of the benefits of Cedar Brook is that we are a Forest School and children spend most of their time outside.

As the province of New Brunswick continues to monitor the COVID-19 pandemic, we will work to the best of our capacity to ensure that all children at Cedar Brook stay safe and healthy.


